RE: Next Resident Member of the Review Committee for Anesthesiology

The Review Committee for Anesthesiology is requesting nominations for its next resident member for a term to begin on July 1, 2026.

Qualifications of the Resident Member

The resident member must be enrolled in an ACGME-accredited anesthesiology residency program at the time of appointment and may not serve more than one year beyond completion of residency or fellowship. Resident members must have passed the Basic Examination offered by the American Board of Anesthesiology. The term of appointment is two years. Upon completion of a two-year term, the individual may not be appointed again to the same Review Committee.

Resident members may not serve on two Review Committees simultaneously and must not be from the same state or institution as another member of the committee. At the time of the next resident member's appointment, these states and institutions will include:

- Endeavor Health/NorthShore University Health System, Evanston, Illinois
- Indiana University-Bloomington, Bloomington, Indiana
- University of Louisville School of Medicine, Louisville, Kentucky
- Mayo Clinic, Rochester, Minnesota
- St. Louis Hospital for Children, St. Louis, Missouri
- Columbia University Medical Center, New York, New York
- Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai, New York, New York
- University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, North Carolina
- Cleveland Clinic, Cleveland, Ohio
- Lehigh Valley Health Network, Allentown, Pennsylvania

Responsibilities of the Resident Member

The resident member participates as a full voting member in all Review Committee activities, including program review and policy discussion. The resident member is subject to the same confidentiality, conflict of interest, duality of interest, and fiduciary responsibility policies as the other members. The resident member must be able to devote an estimated 15-20 hours to program review before each Review Committee meeting.

The resident member is also a member of the ACGME Council of Review Committee Residents (CRCR). The CRCR is composed of the resident member(s) of each Review Committee and is an important part of the ACGME because it provides valuable input and feedback to the ACGME Board of Directors about matters related

to residents and fellows, graduate medical education, and accreditation from the resident/fellow perspective. The CRCR meets twice a year, typically in May and September.

Note: It is the program director's responsibility to ensure that the resident member will have the necessary time to review programs, attend Review Committee and CRCR meetings, and participate in activities of the Review Committee and the ACGME as is required for Review Committee members. While this nomination is for a term that officially begins July 1, 2026, the resident member will begin participating in activities six months prior to that start date in order to observe one CRCR meeting and one Review Committee meeting.

Selection of Next Resident Member

The Review Committee will review nominations in September and forward its selections to the ACGME Board of Directors for approval.

To Submit a Nomination

To nominate a resident, submit the following:

- ACGME Review Committee Resident Member Nomination Form
- Resident curriculum vitae
- Personal statement from the resident
- Letter of support from the nominee's program director ensuring that the individual will have sufficient time to review programs, attend Review Committee and CRCR meetings, and participate in activities of the committee and the ACGME as expected

The Review Committee meets three times annually, typically in April, September, and December. The April and December meetings are held at the ACGME office in Chicago, Illinois, while the September meeting is conducted virtually. All travel and meeting expenses are covered by the ACGME.
